Why Should You Avoid the Roads?

The best way to stay safe when the roads are icy is to avoid driving at all. By staying off of the roads altogether, you'll avoid the risk or getting stuck, wrecking or worse.

Buckle Up!

You should always wear a seatbelt, but it's even more critical during dangerous driving conditions. Seatbelts are proven to be the most effective safety measure taken while driving.



Be Aware of Black Ice.

Black ice can be hard to see and blends into the pavement on the roads. If you do get stuck on black ice, don't hit the brakes, take your foot off the gas and avoid overcorrecting the steering wheel.

Slow Down!

If you absolutely can't avoid the icy roads, be sure to reduce your speed. Experts suggest keeping your speed below 45 mph to avoid sliding or losing control of your vehicle.

your surroundings at all times.
